# Competitive Event Prep Chapter 5



#### **Identify**

Competitive events sponsored by FIRST, SkillsUSA, and TSA provide a detailed rubric highlighting the value of different subsystems found in an engineered product. These events require a minimum number of group members. Successful teams require a balance of strengths and weaknesses, and a diversity of skill sets.

## Set up

Locate the most recent guidelines for a desired competitive event. Confirm the number of students eligible to compete in one group. Select a classroom recorder who will record the information.

#### Execute

Engage in a classroom discussion which encourages each student to share his or her personal strengths and weaknesses as a partner. Brainstorm the following categories to serve as a word bank for the discussion:

- work ethic
- mechanical aptitude
- design ability
- drawing
- writing

Draw on this knowledge to make educated decisions when picking a group.
